HOW GOD HAS BEEN "WITH US" AT BYRON UNITED IN 2023

As we approach the end of 2023, we reflect on what has happened at Byron United in the past year. That is what the Leaders' Board did on Saturday, November 18th. We met in person in the church for a full-day planning retreat. This was our first in-person retreat since 2019. We invited members of our three Church Growth Teams to join us. Our discussions focused on ways we **CONNECT**, **GROW** and **SERVE** ... **CONNECTING** with God and each other, **GROWING** spiritually in our faith, and **SERVING** people in our Church family and beyond. We looked at key successes in these areas this year, and then discussed how we can continue to grow in these three areas in 2024.

Our day was a joyful Spirit-filled experience. We praised the Lord in song, read Scripture passages that applied to each of these three areas, and thanked the Lord for His blessings over the past year. We prayerfully requested His continued guidance in 2024. We celebrated our successful experiences this year.... *CONNECTING* through inspiring Worship services, various Fellowship opportunities, and Community Connections reaching out to the Byron area. We listed the many opportunities for *GROWING* spiritually through Discipleship.... small groups for adults, growth in our Sunday school program and now Youth programs on Sunday morning and Wednesday evening. We noted the increased number of people *SERVING* as volunteers within our Church, "Ministering" to our Church family, as well as those *SERVING* others in need through Mission Outreach and Byron Cares Food Bank. We also recognized the generosity of our Church family in your financial support throughout 2023. At the end of the day, we each stated what made us most **THANKFUL**, and what **EXCITED** us most.

I share this information as we enter the season of Advent... a time of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. It is a time of looking forward to celebrating God's amazing gift of His Son. Jesus came as **IMMANUEL ...''GOD WITH US''**. We sing hymns with these words at this time of year. But do we stop to reflect on what **''GOD WITH US''** means throughout the remaining eleven months of each year?

God has been "WITH US" in 2023, and earlier years because we are a Church that prays to Him for His guidance and direction. We held a *Week of Prayer and Waiting on the Lord* to ask Him how He desired to "grow His Church" during this past year. Through that Week of Prayer, we sensed a direction to establish three 'GROWTH TEAMS' which have met regularly to discuss how to GROW in three

different areas. First, in increasing our numbers attending worship. Through their initiatives, we have many new families, representing a multitude of countries, now attending regularly. Second, how to personally grow spiritually. We have several small groups meeting weekly to grow in their faith journey. Alpha provided another opportunity for spiritual growth this year. Third, how to expand ways we voluntarily serve the Lord within and beyond our Church. We now will embark on a Church-wide Campaign, exploring how to share God's love in our everyday lives wherever we may be.

During Advent this year, may we reflect on the **Hope**, **Peace**, **Joy** and **Love** that Jesus came to bring to us. May we give thanks for the ways in which God has fulfilled many of our **Hopes** for 2023 and provided **Joy** for many people in our church family and beyond.

On behalf of the Leaders' Board of Byron United Church, I thank each of you for the **Love** you share with our Sisters and Brothers within our Church family, and also for what you do to share God's **Love** beyond our Church for those in need. May Christmas this year be a blessing to each of you, as we celebrate the birth of our Saviour, and that He came to live WITH US.

Sock It to 'Em and Undie Sunday

Bins were full to overflowing with your donated socks and undies for the homeless in London, thanks to your generosity. Between Ark Aid, the Men's Mission and Byron Cares Food

Bank, Ken and Diane Minshull distributed 62 pair of undies and 276 pairs of socks. Out of cash donations of \$505 they will purchase warm boots, hoodies, coats, hats and mitts. These will be distributed throughout the cold winter months.

Samaritan's Purse – Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Campaign

Fifty-four thoughtfully filled shoe boxes were delivered to the depot here in London. The monetary donations, totaling \$946.50 will be forwarded directly to Samaritan's Purse to be used at their discretion.

Southdale Chaplaincy – Christmas Angel Tree Campaign

Pastor Pam Cullen, the Executive Director of the Southdale Chaplaincy, advised that they will distribute gift bags to families this year as part of their Santa Claus parade. There will be appropriate family gifts in each bag, taking into consideration the ages of the children. Your participation continues to make Christmas a JOY for so many children and their families in the Southdale Chaplaincy, who might otherwise not receive a gift.

Our own Tom de Gryp, organist and choir director, rode 1,000 kilometers around Southwestern Ontario this summer and fall with the goal of raising \$1,000 toward the work of the Outreach ministry. We are SO grateful to Tom and congratulate him and all of you for helping him reach his goal.

At Christmas we celebrate our Lord and Saviour, a babe born in a humble manger. This babe, our Lord, has called us to serve and He has certainly provided us with that opportunity through the Byron Cares Food Bank.

As Christians we practice gratitude and this Christmas we are so very grateful for your generous support. Byron Cares Food Bank volumes have more than doubled over 2022; we served 149 clients in October 2023 versus 65 for the same period last year.
