

Angela is going to coordinate those requesting to come on Sundays to ensure we do not exceed the number expected and to ensure those coming are aware of the following ...

1. Access to the Sanctuary will be between 10:15am and 10:30am, through the main door on Chesterfield Ave.
2. You must use the hand sanitizer provided before entering the building.
3. An usher will check off your name for the purposes of the contact tracing log.
4. You must wear a mask at all times. Please bring your own but we will have some disposable masks for those needing them. If music is played at any time during the service you may sing but please keep your mask on.
5. Please sit so that you maintain an appropriate social distance from others.
6. Please do not see this as an opportunity to fellowship because for the time being we want to keep everyone as safe as possible.

Pastor Martin's Musings *"Hand Sanitizer"*

Hands up, how many of you are fed up using hand sanitizer? It's become part of our new norm, hasn't it? Every shop we go in to we are hand sanitizing and most places are now requiring us to wear masks. Let's do what we can to help reduce our curve and keep each other as safe as possible.

I really don't want to knock using hand sanitizer because I fear the wrath of Dr. Nicola if I do. I'm sure Nicola would be more than happy to point me on the straight and narrow about why we should be using it and more to the point what hand sanitizer we should be using, depending on its ingredients.

Recently I was getting the girls what they needed to go back to school; pencils, paper, a new thermos, and of course masks and hand sanitizer.

The girls were adamant, they wanted some hand sanitizer that smelt good, not that stuff that stinks. They wanted some fruity or mint smelling hand sanitizer.

They got me thinking.

Why do we use hand sanitizer? I'm no medical person but I'm assuming that a good hand sanitizer will kill the germs we have on our hands. So in essence we have bad stuff on our hands and hand sanitizer gets rid of it. Again I can hear Dr. Nicola telling me that washing your hands frequently with soap and water is a better way to do that, but this musing is about hand sanitizer so let's keep with the idea that it does actually remove the thing we want removed.

Isn't it great that we can so easily remove the stuff we don't want from ourselves, and isn't it even better that we can pick and choose the stuff we want to use in order for our clean selves to smell better afterwards.

I'm guessing all of us would prioritize using a hand sanitizer that removes the crud whether it smells good or not, right? Actually the worse the hand sanitizer smells the more I think it is actually doing what it is supposed to do.

Am I the only one who thinks that way? Sometimes I spray this sweet smelling thing on my hands and I wonder has it actually done any good, or do I need to go and wash my hands as soon as I can. even though my hands smell like a strawberry I wonder if all that has happened is that I have added an oily lotion to my hands which enables the germs to slide around easier from one place to another rather than actually destroy them.

To me the worse the hand sanitizer smells the more convincing it is that it is going to do what I need it to do.

Imagine being covered in something awful, so awful in fact that no soap would remove it, ever? Imagine being so covered in this dirt and grim that you don't even know it because it has just become part of the norm.

Then one day you come to a realisation that you are covered in this stuff and that's not the way you were meant to be. So all you need to do is get this hand sanitizer and cover yourself in it. So you ask for it and you discover it is blood. The blood of a man who died for you so you can be washed in his blood. Sounds horrific doesn't it? But it is exactly what we need, all of us.

We need to be washed in the blood of the Lamb.

Can you hear the lyrics of that old hymn? I can hear you singing ...

In the midst of this ongoing pandemic our lives have taken on some new habits, not least wearing masks and using hand sanitizer all the time.

The next time you use hand sanitizer smell your hands as soon as you do it? I hope they stink. If they do I hope they remind you that your hands were filthy and they so badly needed to be washed. And then take a brief moment and say "thank you" to your Loving Father in Heaven who loved you so much He died for you, so He could wash you in His blood so that in His eyes you are completely clean and you smell so so so very sweet.
